FROM THE PULPIT



Take time to compose your own Collect

Last Sunday, we talked about Collects during the Children's Message. Collects are short liturgical prayers (*prayers used in worship*). Every Sunday we have at least one collect in our worship; the Collect of the Day is prayed just before the biblical readings. A collect is usually just one (*long*) sentence long. A collect takes its name from the way these prayers tend to "collect" the themes of the day or occasion.

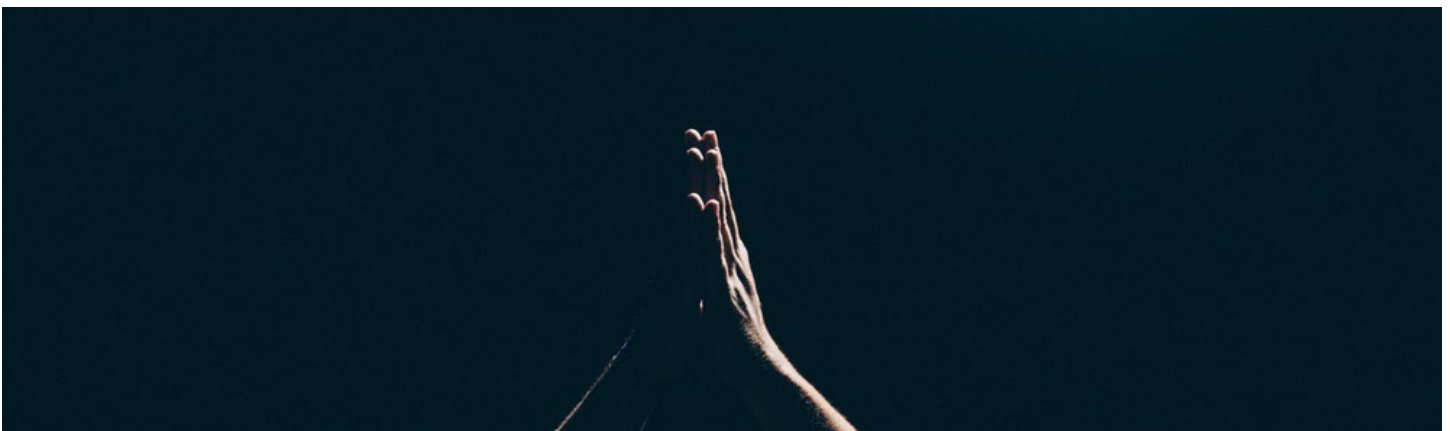
Collects have a consistent form, including: An invocation (*where we address God and say good things about God*) to God – Oh God, you have prepared for those who love you such good things as surpass our understanding; A petition (*where we offer our cares and concerns to God, usually asking God to take action*) – Pour into our hearts such love towards you, that we, loving you in all things and above all things, may obtain your promises, which exceed all that we can desire; And a conclusion – through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. AMEN (*Collect for the Sixth Sunday of Easter*)

Summer is a good time to try new things! Why don't you consider writing your own weekly Collects? Spend some time

at the beginning of each new week and think about your week ahead. What have you got coming up? Vacation? An appointment with a doctor? Weeding in the garden? Visitors? Then think about how these things make you feel. Nervous? Excited? Grateful? Exhausted? Compose a collect that offers your hopes and fears for the week to God and invites God to reveal God-self to you during the week ahead. Then you can pray your own custom made collect every day during the week! You can do this on your own or as a family or you can invite someone to be your prayer partner.

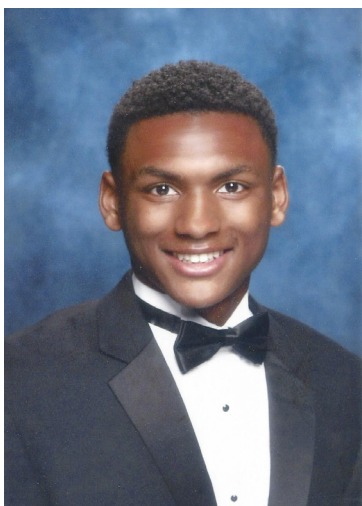

DEREK BRADY VEREEN JR.



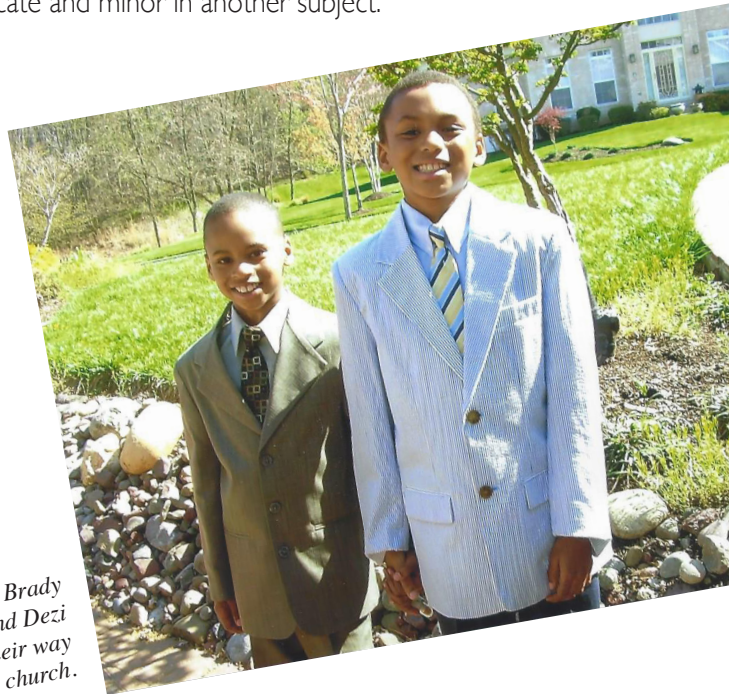
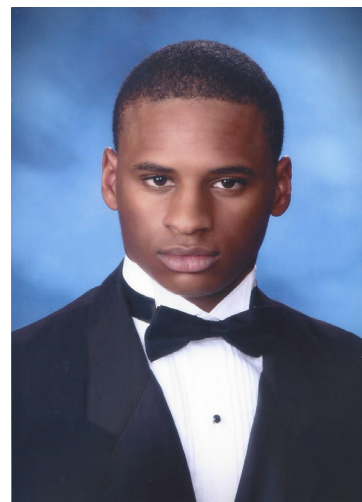

She also attended Duke Ellington High School in Washington, DC and ran track, was a dancer and a softball player.

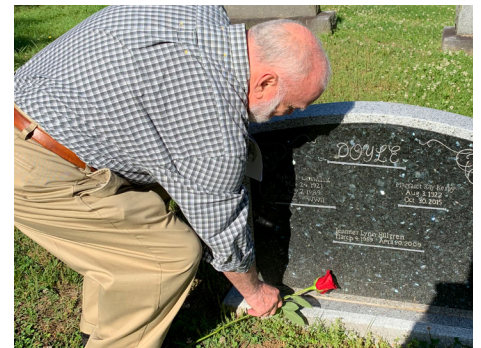

What a double blessing to have both of them at St. John's!

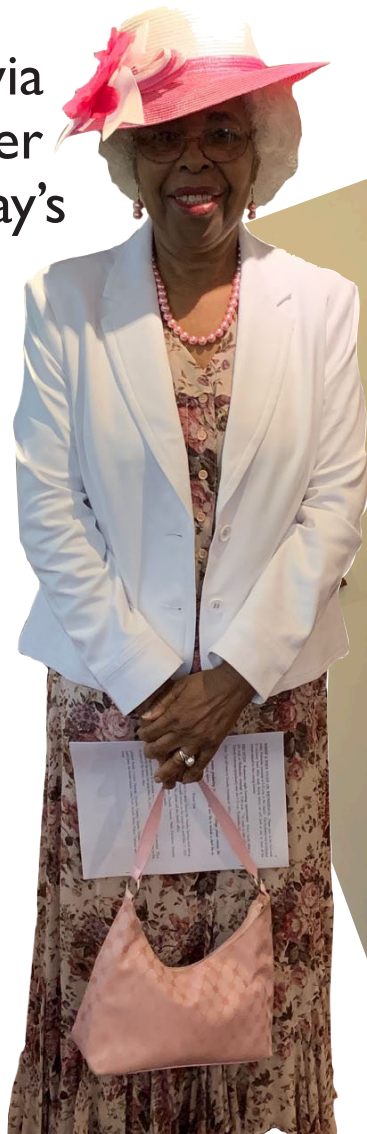

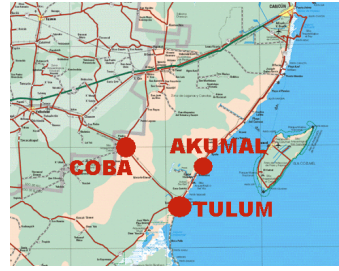

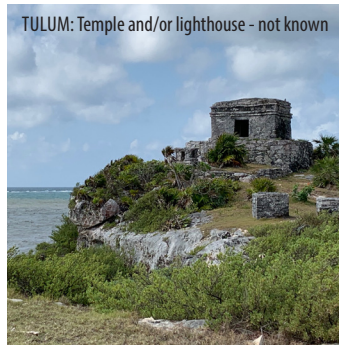
Enjoy a different destination every month:
Tulum & Coba (Mexico)

Tulum is the site of a pre-Columbian Mayan walled city which served as a major port for Coba, in the Mexican state of Quintana Roo. The Tulum ruins are the third most-visited archaeological site in Mexico, after Teotihuacan and Chichen Itza, receiving over 2.2 million visitors in 2017. A large number of cenotes are located in the Tulum area such as Maya Blue, Naharon, Temple of Doom, Tortuga, Vacaha, Grand Cenote, Abejas, Nohoch Kiin and Carwash cenotes and cave systems.

Coba is an ancient Mayan city on the Yucatán Peninsula, located in the Mexican state of Quintana Roo. The site is the nexus of the largest network of stone causeways of the ancient Mayan world, and it contains many engraved and sculpted stelae that document ceremonial life and important events of the Late Classic Period (AD 600-900) of Mesoamerican civilization.

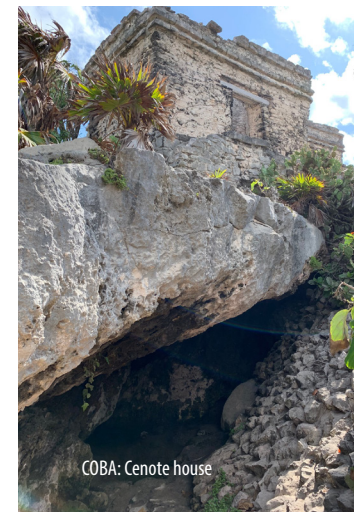

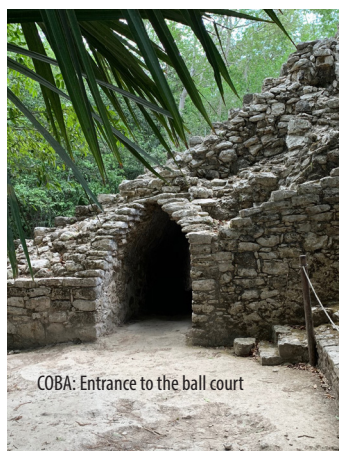

While the Pantry can purchase most food items from the DC Food Bank, there are some necessary items that are not available.

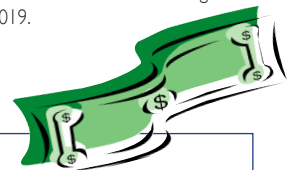
The St. John's Women's Ministry is collecting the following items: paper towels, toilet paper, toothpaste, tooth brushes, bars of soap, and deodorant.

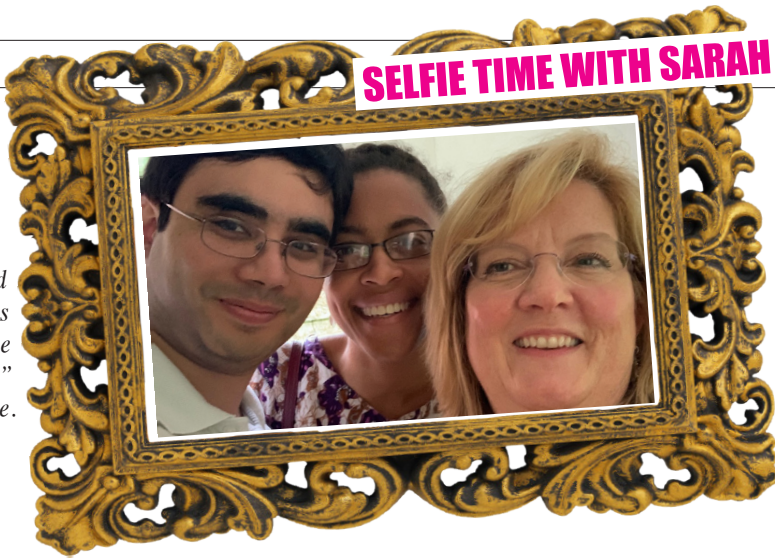

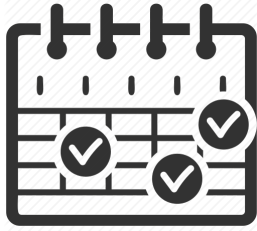

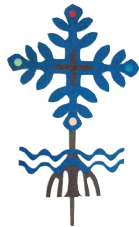
