Planting Seeds Filled With Hope

Round about this time of year – late fall/early winter (in Minnesota) – the seed catalogs would begin to arrive in the mail...Burpee, Harris, and others. My mother always set them aside in a special pile next to her chair. Mom put all the other catalogs we received in mounds by the 3 wood burning stoves in our home; we used their pages to build fires. This special pile of catalogs tickled my curiosity. I asked my mother why she put the seed catalogs in a special pile. She said she was saving them.

"Why?" I asked.

"I'm saving them for when I need hope." She replied.

"Hope?" This answer made no sense to me.

"Yes, hope. In January, when I am sick and tired of winter, these seed catalogs will remind me that spring and summer will come. Planning our next garden gives me hope."

The theme of our annual giving campaign is Planting Seeds. Seeds are filled with hope – the promise of new life.

Fort Washington Medical Center Joins Adventist HealthCare in 2019

Adventist HealthCare and Nexus Health/Fort Washington Medical Center announced on Monday, October 28, 2019 that they have signed a definitive merger agreement to have Fort Washington Medical Center, an acute-care hospital in Prince George's County, to become part of Adventist HealthCare.

St. John's members Charles Day, Ike Puzon and Eric Odderstol served on the FWMC board.



Fort Washington Medical Center is a 37-bed hospital located just south of National Harbor in a growing section of the region. It cares for close to 40,000 patients a year in its emergency department and, like Adventist HealthCare, has a strong commitment to serving the needs of their community.

Given the changes in healthcare both nationally and in Maryland, joining Adventist HealthCare will allow Fort Washington Medical Center to expand its high-quality healthcare services in Prince George's County and overcome the challenges of operating as a standalone community hospital. Adventist HealthCare will invest \$35 million over five years to help the Medical Center continue to meet the needs of the community.

"Bringing Fort Washington Medical Center into the Adventist HealthCare family provides opportunities to combine our shared missions of improving the health of Maryland residents," said Terry Forde, President & CEO of Adventist HealthCare. *"Our organization has a long tradition of serving Prince George's County, and we look forward to strengthening the Medical Center's presence in that part of the region through outpatient services, as well as expanded physician practices."*

Adventist HealthCare, founded in 1907, serves patients throughout the Washington, D.C., region. The organization features a comprehensive spectrum of care including: two acute-care hospitals; a physical rehabilitation hospital with outpatient locations; physician practices; and services for mental health, home care, imaging and urgent care. It is a regional leader in heart, stroke, physical rehabilitation, cancer, OB, and other

medical specialty care. On Aug. 25, its new Adventist HealthCare White Oak Medical Center will open just off Route 29 in Montgomery County, replacing the current Washington Adventist Hospital in Takoma Park.



"Joining Adventist HealthCare represents a major milestone in our longstanding mission to provide quality healthcare to our community," said Henry W. Mosley, chair of the board that oversees Fort Washington Medical Center. *"We pledge a continued, shared commitment to healthcare innovation and look forward to building on our promise to our patients to create a model of care that improves choice, access and enhances the quality of care."*

Adventist HealthCare and Fort Washington Medical Center will spend the next months outlining strategic plans and determining how best to grow services and operations.

I am thrilled to call our diocese together for a weekend of spiritual rededication and renewal **January 24-26, 2020**, culminating in a public revival with Presiding Bishop Michael Curry on **Sunday, January 26, at 2 p.m.** at the Entertainment and Sports Arena in Washington, DC.

The theme for the weekend and for the revival itself is More Jesus; More Love, a reminder that only as we draw closer to Jesus can we grow in our capacity to love as Jesus loves. Plans are underway now for a series of events over the weekend to help us individually and as communities of faith to take our next steps toward Christ and follow in his way of love.

The revival weekend will also mark the official launch of our strategic vision for the next five years.

VOLUNTEER ROLE DESCRIPTIONS

Area Captains - manage ushers in assigned areas at Arena

Eucharistic Ministers - set up and break down ministry stations; distribute communion

Ushers - direct the flow of people as they take their seats, receive communion, offer collection, and depart




PRIDE, CONFIDENCE, AND JOY



Gordon C. James acolyte and confirmand from St. John's Broad Creek will be back home in Fort Washington for the first week of December. He will be at The Oxon Hill Library on Monday, December 2 at 6:10 p.m. and at Mahogany Books (1231 Good Hope Rd. SE, Washington, D.C.) on Saturday, December 7 from 2-4 p.m. He is hoping to see his St. John's

family out in force, old friends and new, to support him on these occasions.

Gordon attended Suitland High School Center for the Visual and Performing Arts and received a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree from the School Of Visual Arts in New York City.



He was hired at Hallmark Cards, Inc. after a nation wide search that chose only two full time illustrators. He illustrated **Crown- An Ode To The Fresh Cut** which was on many best seller/best reads lists to include that of NPR and The New York and LA Times. **Crown** earned several major literary awards including the **Newberry** (Honor); the **Caldicott** (Honor); the **Ezra Jack Keats** (Honor); and the **Coretta Scott King** (Honor); and, he won the national **Gold Medal for 2018 from the American Society of Illustrators**. Finally, in October 2018, he won the coveted **Kirkus Award**.

He and author Derrick Barnes shared several of these awards. In 2018, another book he illustrated, **'Let 'Er Buck,'** a children's biopic about African-American bronco rider George Fletcher was released. It continues to earn rave reviews; and, currently, he is working on more book commissions and continuing to travel to meet lecture invitations at schools, libraries, and book festivals.

Gordon hopes to be at Potomac Landing (his old elementary school), The Bishop Walker School, and of course **St. John's Broad Creek** to reminisce and share his experiences.

We don't give thanks for winning a ball game; we give thanks for the remarkable joy this team has brought to a city in desperate need of something to celebrate.







These school kits will be delivered to needy children in storm-ravaged regions such as the Bahamas and/or to refugee camps in places such as Lebanon and Kenya.

Special thanks to those who donated (at last count) \$710.00 to cover the \$520.00 for Church World Service's shipping and handling costs, for our packaging, and the purchase of missing items "at the last minute".
